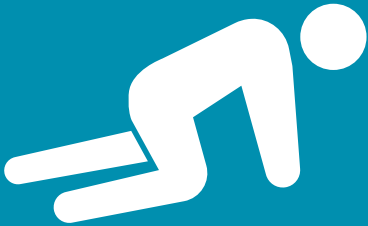


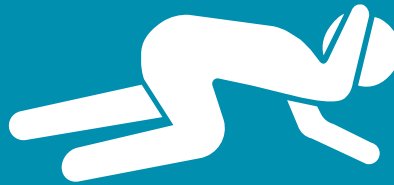
What to Do in an Earthquake

DROP



Drop down to the ground, so the earthquake doesn't knock you down.

COVER



Cover your head and neck with your arms to protect yourself from falling debris. If possible, crawl under a sturdy piece of furniture. Stay away from glass, windows, outside doors and walls, and other items that could fall.

HOLD ON



Hold on to any sturdy item you can until the shaking stops.

If You Are Inside

Stay inside. Do not get in a doorway – this does not provide protection from falling or flying objects, and you might not be able to remain standing.

If You Are Outside

Move away from buildings, street lights, and utility wires.

If You Are in a Vehicle

Pull to the side of the road and stay inside until the earthquake is over. Do not stop under overpasses or power lines.

Stay Safe After



Anticipate aftershocks to follow. Be ready to again Drop, Cover, and Hold On if you feel shaking once more
